

Immersion to the Green and Cultural Schools in Southeast Asia

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Background & Rationale

In the past 6 years, before coming to APLP land, I worked as Program Manager of QUEST, an education reform program in Sarangani Province, Philippines. I passionately devote myself in improving access for basic elementary and secondary education among my fellow indigenous groups. I strongly believe that education will pull my marginalized group out from poverty.

Aside from the heartbreaking poverty that has been oppressing us for a very long time; we are still widely discriminated and politically maneuvered. The programs and efforts geared towards cultural restoration, promotion and empowerment are oftentimes not highly strengthened and sustained. In fact, throughout the years, the efforts have always been very dependent on the political atmosphere. Thus, I felt the dire need to establish an organization that will uphold and strengthen our cultural identity without being threatened by political changes. This institution will be called the Philippine Blaan Foundation and one of its projects will be the Blaan School which will focus on secondary education. The mission of the school is to prepare and empower the future Blaan leaders in a rapid-changing time while enjoying great sense of cultural identity, dignity and pride.
